FIVE FAST FACTS FOR FRIDAY NJCDD



- The Council is authorized by the federal Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act, and in New Jersey State government by NJSA 30:1AA 1.2 and is codified in Title 10 of the State Administrative Codes. State law places the Council "in but not of" the New Jersey Department of Human Services.
- Individuals with developmental disabilities, immediate family members, or guardians of people with developmental disabilities may be eligible to become NJCDD Council members. To apply, interested individuals may contact the Governor's Office of Appointments at 609-777-0251 for an application.
- The members of the New Jersey Council on Developmental Disabilities hold meetings on a quarterly basis to discuss best practices, hearing from projects funded by NJCDD, and conducting business to be an effective outcome for people with developmental disabilities and their families.
