

For over 45 years, ASAH has advocated for legislative and regulatory changes that improve the quality of life for students with special needs and their families.

ASAH is a vibrant and well-respected statewide not-for-profit organization founded by thirteen pioneering private schools in 1974. Today our members – 89 private schools and agencies at 130 locations in New Jersey – provide specialized services to 11,000 infants, children, teens and young adults with a full range of educational, behavioral, physical, medical, social and learning disabilities.





Partnerships with Families

Students are referred to member schools by local school districts. If the program is appropriate and can fulfill the student's Individualized Education Programs (IEP), he or she is served at no cost to families. ASAH offers families:

- An online directory of private special education school programs
- A toll-free Parents' Assistance Line
- Advocacy assistance and IEP help
- Newsletters, guides and booklets in both English and Spanish
- Informative website, with resources, advocacy tools and videos
- A free speaker's bureau
- Workshops and seminars

Excellence

Our member schools meet or exceed state and national standards in every area, including staff credentials and curriculum. All of our member schools are monitored and approved by the New Jersey Department of Education, and/or are accredited by outside agencies such as Middle States Association, The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), and the National Association of Private Special Education Centers (NAPSEC/NCASES).



Accountability

Our schools use tools and teaching strategies that are based on research and best practice. Data shows that students who graduate from our member schools go on to find meaningful employment and live as independently as possible in the community.

Cost Effective

Our studies show that when all costs are considered, private special education is less costly to New Jersey taxpayers than comparable public school programs, when it comes to serving students with complex needs.

Partnerships with Public Schools

Our members can help public schools enhance the scope and quality of their own special education services through:

- Training, on-site support and curriculum development
- Consultative services to facilitate the transition back to a public school setting
- Program development and expansion
- Booklets, guides and newsletters
