# Disability Rights New Jersey



- DRNJ is a non-profit organization that provides advocacy services to people with disabilities. DRNJ provides information and referral, technical assistance and training, legal and non-legal advocacy, and outreach and education.
- Services are currently provided free of charge.
- DRNJ provides comprehensive and targeted technical assistance, training, education and outreach to people with disabilities, families, advocates, service providers and others in New Jersey on a range of relevant topics
- You could be eligible to receive services from DRNJ if you have a disability, a problem related to your disability or an issue/problem falls within agency priorities.
- Requests for assistance are made through the DRNJ Intake Unit, which is open from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday by telephone and in-person by appointment.
